


Attendance Level




Semester 2 attendance





Regular reading is a great holiday activity to maintain your child's progress and build a culture of reading at home. Just 30 minutes a day can significantly impact your child's literacy skills, whether they are reading, being read to or both.

Looking Ahead

Next year, our library will focus on updating the non-fiction collections to match student interests and support the fantastic learning in the classroom. Whether learning about the success of soccer players or how to make a vanilla cupcake, our revitalized nonfiction collections will be something our students will be looking forward to in 2024.

If they start reading for 20 minutes per night in Kindergarten, by the end of 6th grade, Student A will have read for the equivalent of 60 school days, Student B will have read for 12 school days, and Student C will have read for 3.

Academic Challenge Term 4

In term 4, we went back to Fairfield High School to compete for our last Academic Challenge for 2023. With three veterans, Thien Phan, Jason Tran and Nang Tran, we have also included 3 new team members Kathy Nguyen, Lam Tran, and Anthony Nguyen.



The focus for this term's challenge was English, History, Geography and EAL/D. The challenge consisted of four activities. Teams had to work collaboratively in walking dictations;

Students are divided into 2 groups, readers, and recorders. A reader walks up to a passage to read, and memorise then walk back and report it. A scribe then records what has been said accurately and arranges the passage in order. They must recapture a story and arrange it in chronological order.





The second task was to identify about 75 different world heritage landmarks, matching them with the cities they belong to and their countries. Would you be able to name these famous landmarks and their locations?

Our third task was the scavenger hunt, students must work collaboratively to find 12 different items around the library including fiction and non-fiction books as well as HSC and EAL/D books.



Once again, our team showed excellent teamwork, perseverance and exceptional courage when facing challenging tasks. They didn't give up. Well done to all the members in the Academic Challenge Team this year. Thank you for your dedication and hard work, and we are so proud of each one of you.
